Credits transfer

All SNU International Summer Program courses are regular, curricular subjects that award academic credits upon completion of the course. All International Summer Program courses carry 2 or 3 Korean credits, where 1 credit is given for every 15 hours (or more) of lectures per semester.

Most universities allow credit transfer of courses taken at overseas universities, but prospective students must check with their department or academic adviser before registering at SNU International Summer Program to see if the credits of the course you wish to take can be acknowledged by your home university.

Scholarship

• Early Registration Scholarship

Students who complete online application and course registration by the deadline (April 7, Korean Standard Time) below will be given 20% discount of the tuition, without filing an individual request. Please note that for additional course registration afterwards, early bird benefits will not apply.

» Applicants who have finished submission of a complete online application and course registration will be given an invoice via flywire through their e-mail with the discounted price.

* For students who choose to pay by wire-transfer, please note that as international wire-transfer may take a few days, applicants may submit a proof of wire transfer and upon the date that the wire transfer is made, early bird benefits will apply.

• Korean/East Asian Study Scholarship

Students who are currently majoring in Korean or East Asian Study at overseas universities will be rewarded with scholarship (20% reduced tuition), without filing an individual request. The eligible applicants must fill in their major correctly in the online application, which must be supported by the academic transcript.

• Partner University Scholarship (including APRU, AEARU, AUA, AUF member universities)

Students who are currently attending SNU's student exchange partner universities will be rewarded with scholarship (10% reduced tuition), without filing an individual request. The eligible applicants must fill in their home university correctly in the online application, which must be supported by the academic transcript.

• Other Scholarships

Students who are eligible for either of the criteria below must submit a proof document when they fill in the online application.

Visa

Many countries have a visa exemption agreement with Korea, that allows up to a 90-day visa-free stay in Korea.

To check your country's visa exemption status, visit the Korea's Ministry of Foreign Affairs website: <https://www.mofa.go.kr/>. Students from countries with a visa exemption agreement that is shorter than our program period, you need a D-2 visa (a short-term student visa) to attend our program. Since additional or different documents might be required and the application submission method might differ depending upon which Korean Embassy you will go to, please check with the Korean Embassy where you are planning to apply for your visa. The SNU International Summer Program will assist in providing additional documentation needed. Please email us at summer@snu.ac.kr.


Visa issuance can take up to a month, so it is highly recommended that students who need a visa complete their registration at SNU as early as possible.

Housing



We provide two options for On-Campus Housing. The first option would be Gwanak Residence Hall, which is a regular student dormitory. The second option is SNU Hoam Faculty House (Hoam Hotel), which is an on-campus hotel.

The SNU Dormitory, Gwanak Residence Hall, is located in SNU's Gwanak campus and is within walking distance from classrooms, the library, and cafeterias. All rooms are double occupancy, and each room is shared by SNU International Summer Program (ISP) students.



The rooms are fully equipped with a private washroom and shower, air-conditioner, beds, closets, and desks/chairs as well as a shared mini-refrigerator. SNU International Summer Program (ISP) will be providing bedding and pillows free of charge.

In the dormitory building, there are laundry rooms with washing machine and dryer where students can do their laundry (detergent not provided), and on each floor, there is a shared common room with a microwave and a single-burner portable induction stove.

The Hoam Faculty House(Hoam Hotel) is also located in Gwanak Campus not far from the Gwanak Residence Hall. All rooms offered are Standard Twin rooms with double occupancy. Each room is fully equipped with a TV, DID telephone, AC, emergency exit, heating & cooling installations, Wi-Fi, electric kettle, and an iron & ironing board.

*Both On-Campus housing are not guaranteed for all students as there are limited spots available. Rooms are allotted on a first-come, first-served basis to students who request during register period.
